

Tutorial for the *Xreading Speed Reading* component

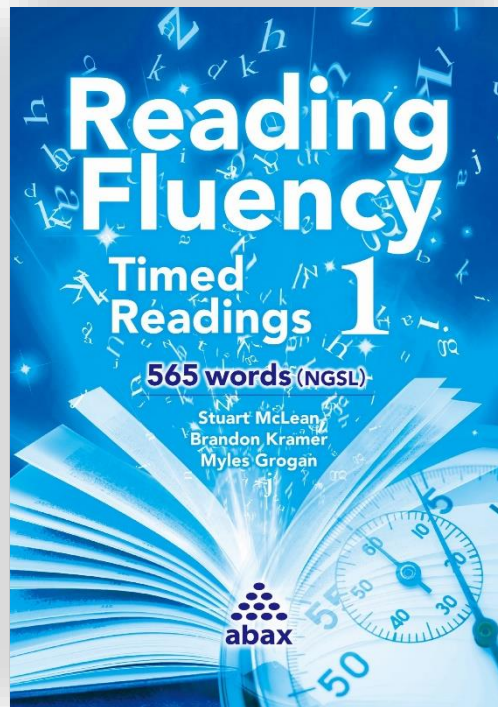
While doing extensive reading is a great way for students to improve their reading fluency, research shows that combining extensive reading with a dedicated speed reading program, one in which students spend several weeks reading short easy passages as quickly as possible is even more effective.

Therefore, we have partnered with the publisher Abax and are using their three new *Reading Fluency – Timed Reading* books for our new speed reading component. Each book has 22 short easy passages and each time a student reads a passage, their time is automatically recorded, and their progress is tracked.

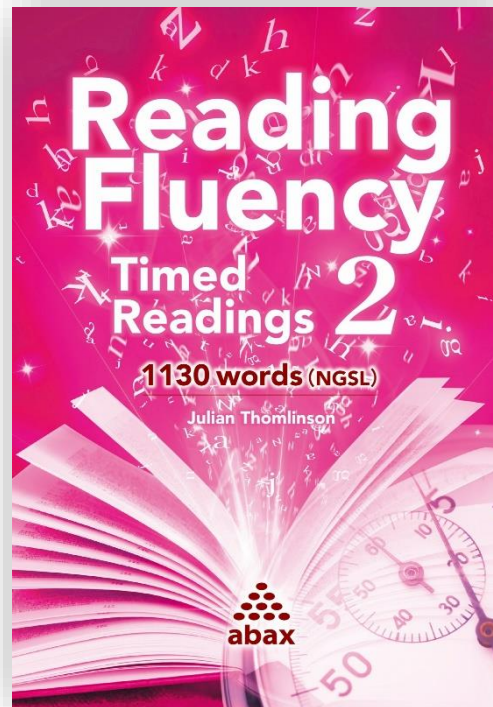
If you have your students to read a few passages per week, they should soon see their speed improve.

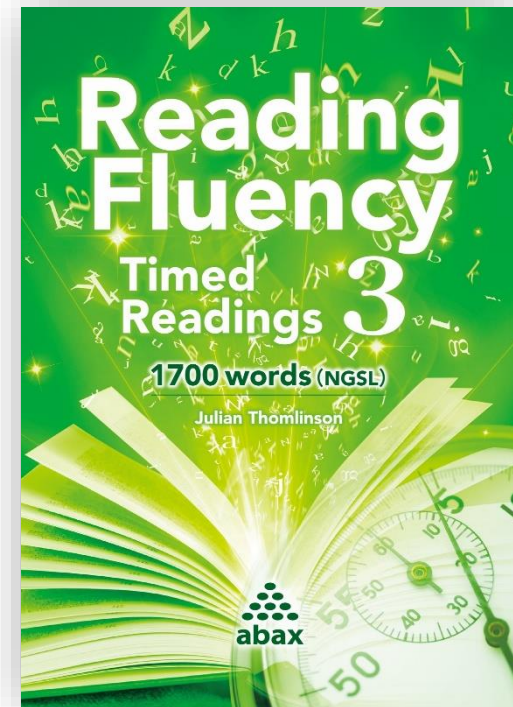
Currently, only *Book 1* is available on Xreading. *Book 2* and *Book 3* books will be available early next year.

Creating a speed reading assignment is very similar creating a regular assignment in Xreading. Most of the settings are the same as a regular assignment. The main difference is you can allow students to read the same passages multiple times.

Start by going to the *Speed Reading* page, and press *Add Speed Reading* button.

Instructions for Speed Reading

1. Select the Class(es) you want to create a speed reading assignment for.
2. Select the Speed Reading Book (currently only one book, *Reading Fluency - Book 1*, but more levels coming soon)
3. Select the *Open* and *Close* dates.
4. You can change the default settings if you want. By default, students can read a passage once, but you can allow them to reread a passage if they failed the quiz, or whenever they want.
5. Write a message if you want.
6. By default, all 22 passages of the book are selected, but you can restrict to any that you want.
7. Press the *Add Assignment* button

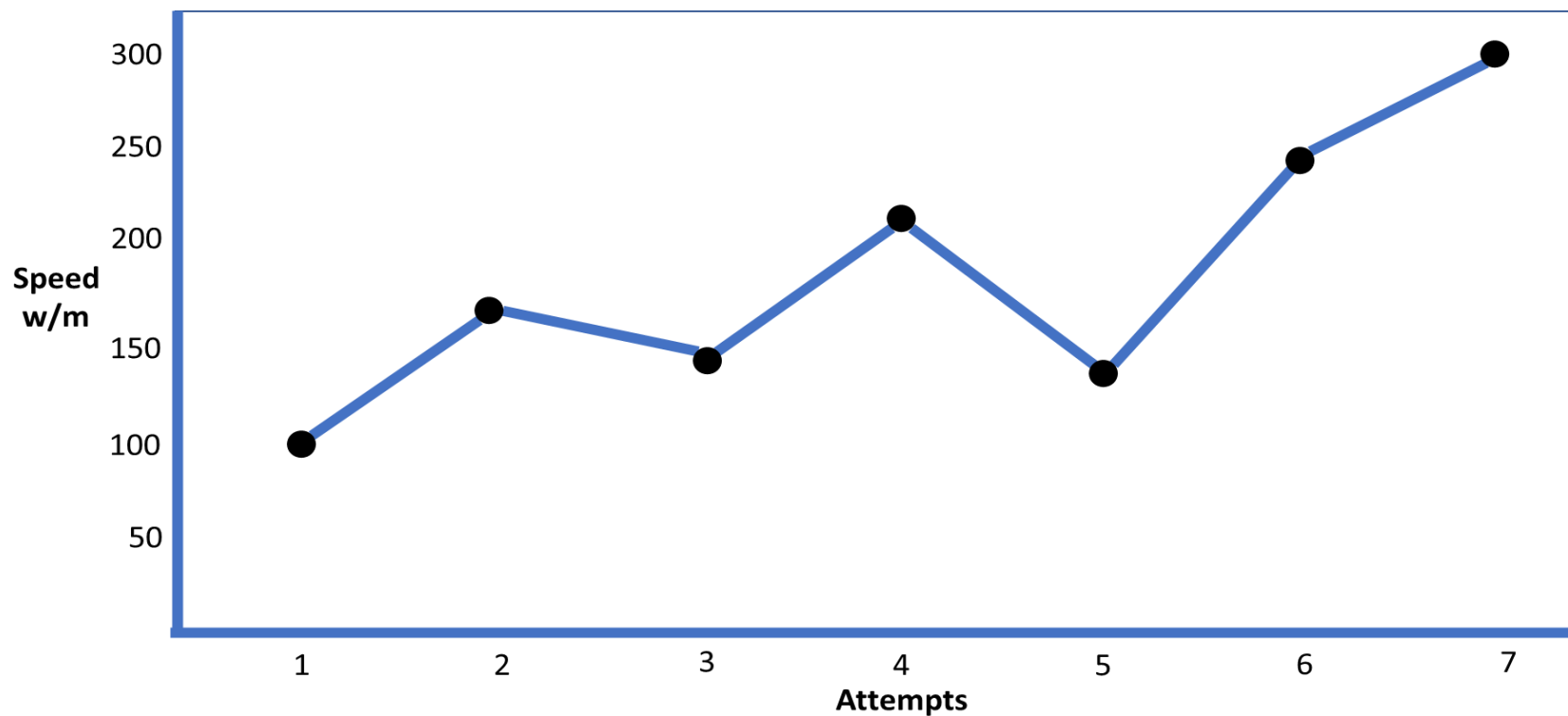

Speed Reading for Students

Introduction from the publisher

Reading Fluency has 22 timed readings. Weekly practice with these readings will help you to read more easily and smoothly. Each reading is designed to help you to quickly build the skills you need:

- They are short – about 400 words long.
- The words are easy. Most of them come from the first 565 most common words of English according to the New General Service List (NGSL)
- We have chosen the grammar items carefully, so the articles are easy to read quickly.
- Each reading has five True/False questions to help you check your understanding.

Focus on reading quickly more than understanding every word. When you answer the questions after the articles, try to get at least four answers correct. If you get less than four, you may need to slow down a little bit.

Tips to Read Quickly

1. DO NOT use pens, fingers, or rulers to follow the words. Follow the words on the page with your eyes only. Using a pen, a finger or ruler may slow you down. It can also mean that you cannot read without using a pen or a ruler.
2. DO NOT circle or underline things when reading. Go to the end as quickly as possible, without stopping.
3. DO guess the meaning of unknown words.
4. DO miss words you do not understand. You can learn these after you have finished the reading.
5. DO practice often. Try to do at least one reading every week and re-read each article many times.

Regular practice will help to build your skill. Practicing often and recording your progress will show you that you are getting better. We hope that this will help to feel good about your ability, and that this book can help you quickly become fluent and successful readers!

Many things can change your reading speed, such as your mood, where you are, and whether the topic is interesting to you, so don't feel bad if you have some slow days. The important thing is to see improvement overall.

Students can see their *Active Speed Reading* assignment in the middle of their homepage.
To start reading, they should press the *Read Passage* button

- Speed is important! Jump or skip unknown words.
- When you reach the end, press finish, and then answer the five questions.

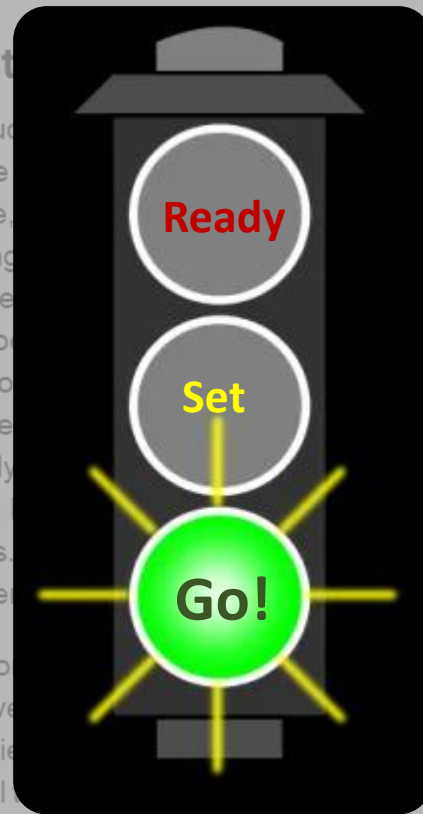

After finishing a passage, students have to take the quiz, otherwise, they will not get credit for the passage. Unlike a regular assignment, the quiz cannot be taken later.

The *Speed Reading* component is still in *beta* meaning not all features we have planned are completed, and some do not work perfectly, so your feedback will be appreciated.

We plan to add the following features early next year:

- Two more books, Reading Fluency Books 1 and 2
- A graphical display showing a student's progress
- More settings, such as a quiz time limit, and maximum reading speed (to prevent students from just pressing the Finish button right away)
- Ability for students to change size of text and background color while reading
- Ability for instructors to edit and/or delete a student's attempt
- Fix issues with columns not sorting properly
